Power, Place and People

Tutor: Dr John Hunt, BA, PhD, FSA, FRHistS, PGCE.

This day school will explore selected aspects of the often complex and symbolic relationship between power, place and people, generally encapsulated by buildings, landscapes and how they were used. Drawing on examples from the medieval western midlands and beyond, our discussion will range across secular and ecclesiastical power; and address family, individual and 'corporate' contexts.

The principal focus of the day will be twofold. Firstly, through case studies of the earls of Warwick and the barons of Stafford in particular, the factors affecting the rise and fall of aristocratic families and the role of 'place' will be examined. Secondly, the role of 'place' in the expression of ecclesiastical power will also be investigated, taking both monastic and episcopal examples, particularly Worcester and Lichfield in the case of the latter. Finally, the manifestation of urban corporate or civic power will be encountered in passing.
